Encounter with a Princess

The 1970s and 190s marked a significant period of construction in the Middle East's oil-rich nations, particularly in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA). During this era, high-rise commercial properties and large-scale hospitals composed of concrete and steel were built continuously.

My initial professional assignment was at a newly constructed hospital in Medina, considered the second holiest city in Saudi Arabia. In my capacity as the individual responsible for the safe operation and maintenance of all electrical equipment, I ensured the reliability of essential systems within the facility.

In 1978, the hospital staffed a limited number of Egyptian medical professionals alongside five Filipina nurses. Only two floors were operational for patient care, while the third floor temporarily served as nurses' accommodation, and the fourth level was reserved for special guests.

On one occasion, the director requested my assistance in evaluating the functionality of a television and video player on the fourth floor. Upon inspection, I identified that the NTSC-labeled VHS tapes were incompatible with the existing equipment. I recommend procuring modern, compatible devices from Riyadh.

Subsequently, the director and I traveled to Riyadh, acquired the necessary equipment, and returned to Medina that afternoon. After installing and testing the new system, I demonstrated its capabilities by playing tapes from UK, France, and the United States, which met the client's expectations.

During the demonstration, a woman in a red veil entered, introducing herself fluently in English and expressing interest in the system operation. She later revealed that she was the Princess of Medina, daughter of the Prince. Impressed by the technology, she requested instructions for operating the audiovisual equipment and switching between playback and local broadcasts, which at the time featured animated content and religious programming.

Following this interaction, the princess contacted me several more times without an escort. On one occasion, she requested a demonstration involving music and dance, which I courteously declined to do alone. Her response was lighthearted and cordial.

Before her departure to Switzerland for further education, she asked if there was anything I required. I respectfully requested to see her face; she briefly lifted her veil, revealing her features. I expressed my gratitude for her trust and courtesy.

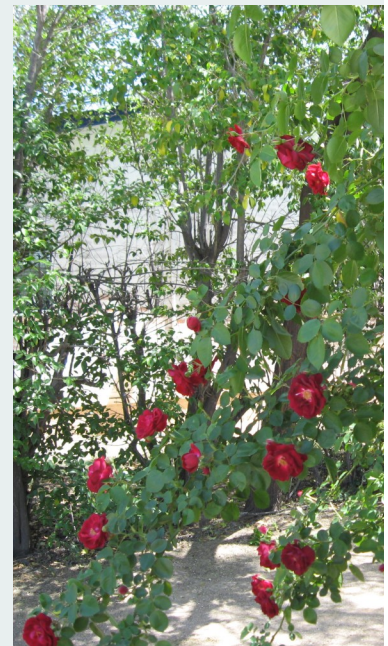
This experience remains vivid in my memory, resembling a scene from a film, yet it was a genuine and formative event in my career.
